Oxford School District Meal Pick Ups

Oxford and Lafayette County | March 17th - March 27th | 9 am - 12 pm

The Oxford School District will continue to provide nutritious meals to students during the temporary closure of schools in six locations throughout the Oxford-Lafayette community. Beginning Tuesday, March 17 through Friday, March 27, OSD will provide free meals on weekdays from 9 am - 12 pm for ALL children (18 years of age and under). Adults can also purchase meals for \$2 at these locations.

Students do not need to enter a building for pick-up. Families should look for an OSD school bus in the parking lot at each location. Meals will be available on a first-come, first-served basis. Because this is a U.S. Department of Agriculture program, Lafayette County School students and families may also take advantage of these nutritious meals.
